Polk County Farm Bureau Ag in the Classroom -- Las Vegas students to virtually tour two Iowa Farms

Three Kindergarten Classes Connect with Iowa Farmers through Google Hangouts.

On Thursday, May 26, 2016 three Las Vegas kindergarten classrooms will virtually tour two central Iowa farms through the Polk County Farm Bureau program Farm Chat at 3:15 – 3:45 p.m. The kindergarteners come from an inner city school with ninety percent of the student population qualifying for free or reduced school lunch. Most of the students have never been outside Las Vegas city limits and even fewer have visited a farm. Using Google Hangouts, the students will be able to interact with the farmers during the tour, ask questions, and help guide the experience.

They visited two locations at Anderson Farms and Red Granite Farm near Boone, Iowa.

The Polk County Farm Bureau board believes strongly in educating the public about the importance and relevance of agriculture. They place a special emphasis on educating youth. As the general public becomes further removed from the farm, children do not have a basic understanding of the origins of their food, fiber, and other agricultural products. Farm Chat allows students to discover where food is grown, experience farm life, and ask farmers questions in real time without the logistics and cost of leaving their classroom. This program is rapidly expanding with endless touring possibilities.
